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## **Bronchoscopy Instructions**

Your procedure is scheduled to be done at Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital of Plano.

Check in at the Outpatient Surgery desk 2 hours prior to procedure unless instructed otherwise by hospital. Please bring any necessary insurance cards and documentation with you for registration. Please bring a list of all medications (prescription and over the counter).

## In preparation for your Bronchoscopy

- 1. Wear loose comfortable clothing. Leave valuables at home including all jewelry and piercings.
- \*\* 2. Do not eat or drink anything after midnight. Also STOP any alcohol.
  - 3. If you must take any routine medications such as blood pressure or heart meds, please do so with a minimum amount of water on your regular schedule.
  - 4. If you have inhalers or a nebulizer, they can be used at any time prior to your procedure.
  - 5. If you are diabetic, hold your blood sugar meds during the time you can not eat or drink. Please check your blood sugar prior to arrival.
  - 6. 5 days prior to your procedure STOP any blood thinners such as Coumadin, Aspirin, Plavix, Eliquis, Xarelto, etc.
  - 7. Remember to take all outside films/cd's not done at hospital with you to your appointment.

## **Following your Bronchoscopy**

- You will need someone to drive you home after the procedure. No taxi or ride sharing please.
- Most people can go home 3-4 hours after the procedure.
- When you get home, just spend the day quietly resting, resume normal eating and drinking and resume prior medicine doses on prior schedules.
- You can expect to resume normal activities the next day.
- During the first 24 hour interval, **DO NOT** drink alcohol, operate a motor vehicle,
  - machinery or power tools, make legal or financial decision or supervise infants or young children.
- You may run fever overnight. Treat it with Tylenol or Advil type medications. However, if new fever develops any time after 24 hours please notify the doctor.
- If you develop sudden extreme shortness of breath or sharp stabbing pleurisy type chest pains please report this to the doctor at 972-964-0170 or proceed to the nearest ER or call 911.

## **Bronchoscopy Results**

- A pathologic diagnosis is generally not available for at least 3 working days.
  - Any delays in getting a pathologic diagnosis is neither a good nor a bad sign. Results are never given to us during a weekend.
- Some culture results might be available after 2 days, but can take up to 7 days (and in rare instances even up to 6 weeks).
- Please contact our office during routine office hours in 4-5 working days to see if any results are available and to arrange any needed follow up office visits or testing.
